Good morning everyone and a warm welcome to you here in Park Church this Sunday morning and an especially warm welcome to my colleague Rev. Catherine Beattie who will conduct worship today as I will be visiting one of our neighbouring congregations, Giffnock's United Reformed Church, as part of a switcheroo of ministers across the Giffnock Churches. 
