# 52<sup>nd</sup> Stated Annual Meeting

Our Annual Meeting was held on the  $21^{st}$  March at which our Treasurer, Peter Watson, presented the audited accounts for 2017. He advised that the Church achieved an overall surplus of £894 for the year ending  $31^{st}$  December, attributed to an increase in donations, significant efforts in fund raising events and to cost efficiencies. In particular our Rededication day had 74 responses from members raising just over £2,500 in one-off donations and pledges to amend future donations to produce an annual increase of £8,500. The accounts are currently with Presbytery and Edinburgh for approval and will then be submitted to the Charities Regulator, OSCR.

Our next afternoon Communion (especially for those having difficulty in attending the Sunday services) will be held on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> May. Please let you're elder or the office know if you intend to come.

# **Retiring Offerings**

The Park has a reputation for its generosity in supporting worthwhile charities with a retiring collection. At our February Communion Service we raised £151 for The Street Pastors. Our next retiring offering will be held at our Communion Service in June for the benefit of the Lodging House Mission.

We also collect for charities via the Jar of Grace which sits in the back corridor. The total raised in 2017 was £206.80 which was donated to the Lodging House Mission. Since the start of the year £90 has been raised so we are hoping to exceed last year's total. (Jim Wilson)

### The Sunday School

The focus for the Sunday School since the start of the 2017-2018 session has been looking into the book of Exodus. Last session we went through key events of Genesis, The Creation, The Great Flood, Abraham and his descendants and Joseph. Now as we move into Exodus, we are looking at God's sovereignty and how the story of Moses is an example of this. We will look at Moses as a baby, the burning bush and the exodus from Egypt. We will discuss how God is in control of every aspect of our lives, bad as well as good.

The materials we have been using for just over a year is the Scripture Union 'On The Way' programme. We have found this programme more beneficial and flexible to deal with the reduced numbers in the Sunday School, as we only require to produce enough materials for those children we have. The materials are also flexible enough to allow us to cover the wider age range we have by providing differing context to the same lesson each week depending on age.

We currently have 13 children registered in the Sunday School and have seen our numbers increase by 4 since Christmas. On average we tend to have 6 or 7 regular attendees. We are very thankful to those parents and grandparents who bring their children to Sunday School and will welcome any new or ad hoc additions any week. We will always have something that children can do. Although officially the starting age is 3, we are happy to welcome any children of any age on a Sunday, so please don't think if you have young children/grandchildren, there are no facilities for them at Sunday School. We also ensure we have cover in place 52 weeks of the year, even during School holidays.
